Cambodia earns \$3 billion from agricultural products exports in first 10 months

Cambodia exported 7.62 million tons of agricultural products in the first 10 months of 2022, earning \$3.07 billion in revenue, according to a report released by the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (MAFF) on Saturday. Main products Cambodia exported included rice, bananas, mangoes, cassava, cashew nuts, corn, palm oil, pepper and tobacco, among others, the report said, adding that China is one of the key buyers of the kingdom's products. Cambodian Minister of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries Dith Tina said Cambodia and China have solid agricultural cooperation as Cambodia has enjoyed exporting milled rice, bananas, mangoes and, most recently, longans to China. "I am confident that we can grow this relationship even more in the years to come," he told Xinhua in a recent interview. "The Chinese market still has much potential to absorb more Cambodian agricultural products and neither country has yet used the maximum potential in this sector." Tina said the Regional Comprehensive **Economic** Partnership (RCEP) trade deal and the Cambodia-China Free Trade Agreement (CCFTA), which both entered into force earlier this year, have injected new impetus into the development of Cambodia's agriculture. "Both free trade agreements will contribute to not only the agriculture sector's growth but also the farmers' welfare and prosperity," he said. Agriculture is one of the four pillars supporting Cambodia's economy. The sector contributed 24.4 percent to the gross domestic product (GDP) in 2021, according to the ministry. Rice is the

main cash crop in the Southeast Asian nation, where some 12.2 million tons of paddy rice was produced in 2021, an increase of 11.6 percent year-on-year, it said. Xinhua

Nearly \$400 million earned by Cambodia in 10 months through rubber, rubber wood exports

In the first 10 months of 2022, from January to October, Cambodia earned more than \$396 million from the export of rubber and rubber wood said the report of the General Department of Rubber. The report, released to local news on November 18, said that as of October, the total revenue of rubber and rubber wood exports was at \$396,140,634. In terms of export volume, as of October 2022, Cambodia exported 264,918 tonnes of rubber, a decrease of 1,552 tonnes, compared to the same period last year. The export of rubber wood reached 1,683 cubic metres. The average selling price of rubber as of October 2022 was \$1,482 per tonne, down \$181 per ton, or 11 percent from the same period last year. As of November 2022, the total rubber production area is 404,044 hectares, of which 310,193 hectares are rubber plantations.

Korean company invests in accommodation to boost Lao real estate market

CBM announces resumption of Chinese Yuan, Thai Baht for export earnings

Export earnings can be made in Chinese Yuan and Thai Baht in addition to the US dollar, the Central Bank of Myanmar notified. The CBM's notice takes effect on those export items; various pulses (green gram, black gram, chickpea and pigeon pea), edible oil crops (peanut and sesame), corn, rubber, fishery products (fish, shrimp, crab, eel) and livestock products (live cattle, hides, frozen meat and dried meat). The traders need to apply for a licence to make Yuan or Baht payments. As per the US dollar policy, 65 per cent of earnings must be exchanged for local currency at the CBM's reference foreign exchange rate, while exporters can use 35 per cent of export earnings or sell them on to others with an over-the-counter rate within one month. The procedures for border trade such as (100 per cent TT advance payment) and circular letter system have not been eased, according to the statement. Those companies that fail to deposit export earnings in local accounts will face a lawsuit.—TWA/GNLM

Domestic car sales to rise before Tet holiday: experts

Hanoi (VNS/VNA) - Vietnam's automotive market is expected to see car sales rise during the holiday season, as the industry continues to recover after sluggish sales during the global pandemic, according to experts. According to the Vietnam Automobile Manufacturers' Association (VAMA), sales volume of automobiles in Vietnam reached 36,560 units in October, an increase of 9.3% over September and 22.7% against the same period last year. The number of passenger cars sold increased by 10% from the previous month to 28,230 units. Deliveries of commercial vehicles grew by 6% to 8,003 units, while deliveries of special-purpose vehicles rose by 4% to 327 units. Meanwhile, there were 20,051 completely knocked-down (CKD) vehicles and 16,509 completely built units (CBUs) sold in October, a rise of 17% and 1%, respectively, compared to last month.In total, 397,457 vehicles were sold by VAMA members in the first 10 months of 2022, up 52% from the same period last year. Auto sales could exceed 400,000 for the first time in eight years. Apart from car sales of VAMA's members, Vietnam's automotive market also saw strong sales of car manufacturers such as Audi, Jaguar, Land Rover. Mercedes-Benz. Nissan. Subaru. Volkswagen and Volvo as well. However, they did not

public make their sales figures.Other manufacturers, such as Hyundai and VinFast, recorded combined sales of 10,000 cars per month. If those figures are added, Vietnam's car sales would surpass the 400,000-unit mark for the first 10 months of the year. Experts said Vietnam's macroeconomic stability, increasingly stable car supply and impressive sales of many newly released models will continue to help the local auto market maintain its growth in upcoming months. The domestic auto market is expected to remain robust in the remaining months this year as it enters the peak season in preparation for coming Tet (Lunar New Year 2023). Dealers have been giving discounts for the end-of-year holiday season and Tet, Vietnamese biggest holiday, which falls in late January in 2023. The Vietnam Motor Show 2022 from October 26-30 also contributed to the increase in auto sales in the 10-month period as a record number of nearly 2,000 units were sold and thousands more were preordered thanks to the show, indicating a revival in demand after two years of sluggishness due to COVID-19.In addition, many automakers have recently released new models to prepare for the year-end high season. According to General Director of Ford Vietnam, Ruchik Shah, the positive sales for Vietnam's car market reflect a recovery after COVID-19. In addition, the fourth quarter of every year is always the best sales time for local dealers./.
